He was loyal and devoted to whatever his job required, even creating fun on the job. Over the years he worked his way up to the position of Hot End Technician, working the furnaces, scrupulously looking for any defects that might prove hazardous to the

company. Asa made many friends at Cardinal FG and will not be forgotten. He continued to remain at his position until the time of his passing.

Everyone who knew Asa knew one very special thing about him. Asa was a genuine people-person. He loved life and he loved so many people, and people loved him. Words do not do justice for the special gift that Asa had for getting to know others. He had one of the most charismatic personalities that words fail to describe. He was so full of life. He was adventurous and spontaneously clever. Everything he did brought life to the humdrum of existence. He was truly the life of the party when amongst friends, always full of laughter and jokes, he lifted others up. He was a magnet that attracted people to him. He had a generous heart and was there for so many people. His love was so very deep for all the many people he knew. In writing this tribute of his life, it is impossible to encompass the essence and life force of Asa. He had more friends than one normally achieves in a lifetime.
