Beatrice Minnie Johnson was born on October 17, 1922 in Durant to William and Bessie Elsworth Weibling and passed from this life on July 20, 2015 in Durant at the age of 92 years, 9 months 3 days. Beatrice married Leo Johnson in 1946 in Ypsilanti, MI and he preceded her in death in September 1971.
