“ I first met Irene in Durant, Oklahoma in 1978, I had taken a job at the old hospital, then called Bryan Memorial Hospital. Looking for something to do after work, put together a girls’ softball team to play in the very competitive Durant Softball League. One day while out at the softball field watching some games, this girl on a very good team caught my eye. She was the best short stop I have ever seen. That girl was as quick as a cat and didn’t let anything get by her. I later found out that she could also burn a ball from outfield to home plate so hard that your hand would sting through your glove for a while!

The team that she was on was the number one team in the league, but I knew that I wanted her on my team. When I found out that she was a single parent with five kids and no job. I convinced the hospital administrator to give her a job in my radiology department as a patient transporter. When I offered her the job, the stipulation was that she play softball on our team.

I liked Irene right away. She had a quick wit and was smart as could be. she was very interested in a lot of things. Especially medical. So, during slow times at work, I would start giving her anatomy and x-ray technology lessons and she soaked it up like a sponge. I had never met anyone with such an aptitude for all things medical. She amazed me. At that time, a person could challenge the American Registry of Radiologic Technology under something called the grandfather clause” if the person met certain criteria, and that is how Irene became a Registered Radiologic Technologist.

We became good friends that lasted over the years. I’m sorry to say that I have not stayed in contact with her these last few years. My loss, but I have no doubt that if I ever needed her for advice or just friendship, she would not hesitate to be there for me.
