James Robert Hedgecoke was born on October 29, 1929 in Amarillo, TX to R.H. Hedgecoke and Opal (Guthrie) Hedgecoke and passed from this life on Tuesday, June 21, 2011 in Denison, TX at the age of 81 years, 7 months and 23 days.

James attended and graduated from Clayton, NM High School in 1947. He proudly served his country as a Captain in the Texas National Guard until his Honorable Discharge and he retired from SW Bell Telephone as a service manager after forty plus years. He married Carroleen M. Meeker on March 5, 1964 in Denison, TX and they spent 47 wonderful years together. He was a member of the First Baptist Church in Durant and lifetime member of the National Rifle Association. James was the Texas National Guard commanding officer and officer in charge of two National High Power Rifle Competition Teams.
