James Leonard Stewart was born on March 26, 1947 in McAlester, Oklahoma to Janet "Dolly" (Carnahan) Stewart and Leonard Stewart and passed from this life on February 6, 2018 at his home in Denison, Texas at the age of 70.

Jim graduated from Wilburton High School in 1965, Eastern Oklahoma State University in 1967 and Southeastern Oklahoma State University in 1970 with a degree in Business Administration and a minor in Sociology. 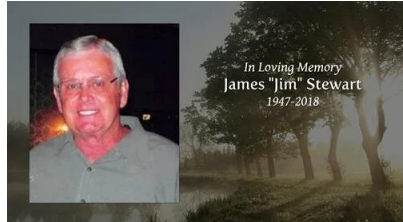
