James Robert Richardson of Durant, Oklahoma passed away on September 22, 2020 at his home at the age of 74. James was born on January 14, 1946 in Portales, New Mexico to Ace Lawton and Vonnie Brument Richardson.

James graduated from Kemp High School and then enlisted in the United States Army and served his country in the Vietnam War from 1967 to 1969 until his Honorable Discharge. “ I met Jim Richardson on December 14, 1968 in Vinh Kim, Vietnam. Jim was the platoon sergeant, I was the platoon medic. Jim, the RTO, and I made up the Command Post (CP) of the platoon. As such, I spent 24 hours a day, seven days a week, with Jim until his tour of duty ended some time in the middle of 1969.

Jim's leadership qualities were second to none. Jim was so good as a platoon sergeant that we seldom had an officer assigned to our platoon. When we did, I found out later, the young officer was assigned to our platoon to learn as much as they could from Jim. Because of Jim's skills, courage, and ability to function under the most adverse conditions, many young men returned home. I had the option of leaving the platoon after two weeks but elected to stay because of Jim. Later, Jim was offered a battle field promotion but turned it down to stay with the platoon.

The last day I saw Jim in Vietnam, he had three days until he was out of combat. Unfortunately, he received a minor wound from a booby trap. I treated his wound. He told me he would stay with the platoon until we reached base camp.

As platoon medic, I called in the highest priority "Dust-off" there was. By the time they picked Jim up, transferred him to a hospital, treated his wounds, there was no way he would serve his last three days in combat. Jim told me that with such a minor wound and a high priority "Dust-off" I was going to be in big trouble. My answer was, "What are they going to do, send me to Vietnam"? That is the last I saw Jim until I contacted him in 1985 to renew our friendship and to get his input on a book I was writing about our platoon.

I was able to meet Jim and his family at military reunions over the years. Great family. I consider Jim a brother.
