Jerry Brockett, 77, of Kingston passed away on Thursday, December 13, 2012 in Kingston. Jerry proudly served his country in the United States Army from February 1954 until his honorable discharge in January 1956 during the Korean Conflict and where he received a National Defense Service Medal.
