Jessie never met a stranger and was quick to light up any room with smiles and fill it laughter. He always had a story to tell and once told be ready to hear

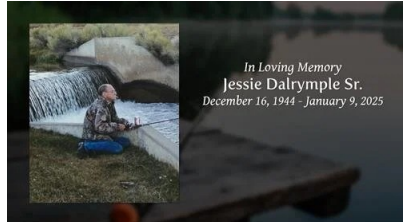

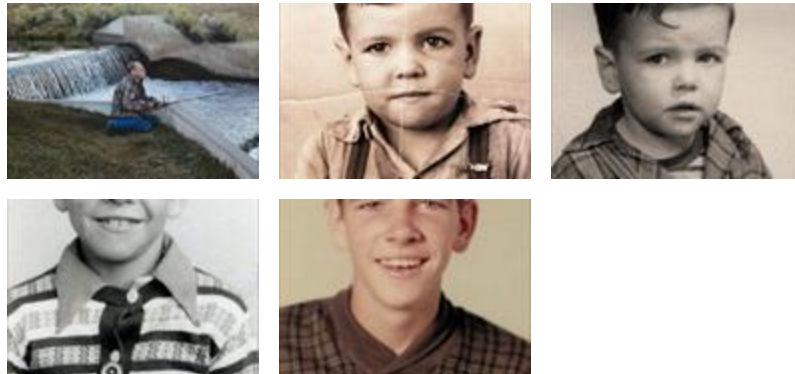
