Winford “Junior” Taylor entered this life on September 22, 1929 in Caney, Oklahoma, born to Arthur Riley and Edna Miller Taylor. Junior went home to be with his Lord and Savior on February 7, 2016 in Caddo, OK at the age of 86 years, 4 months and 16 days.
