March 1, 1919 - July 17, 2009

Mack Ellett, 90, formerly of Coleman, Oklahoma, but residing in recent years in Silo, Oklahoma passed away on Friday, July 17, 2009 in Durant. Mack was born March 1, 1919 near Enterprise (Johnston County) to Stell and Tressie (Evans) Ellett. He grew up in Standing Rock community. They spent 40 more years on a farm near Coleman. In both places they had many beloved friends and neighbors. Mack was an honest, hard working man who was known for his kind and gentle mature and quick wit. He mad friends easily. Once you were his friend, it was for life. He was an unwavering source of strength and love for his family and friends. He could fix almost anything with whatever was at hand (bailing wire was his favorite) and always made time to help anyone in need, whether it be famiy, friend or stranger.

Mack was preceded in death by his parents, three sisters Merle, Lois and Joyce. In his years on earth, he also had to say goodbye to many long-time friends and neighbors.
