



William Andrew Morrison

November 30, 1926 - May 1, 2010

William Andrew Morrison, age 83, of Madill, passed away May 1, 2010 in Madill at Marshall County Medical Center surrounded by his loving family.

He was born November 30, 1926 in Bethel Community, Oklahoma. Andrew Morrison was the son of the late William Andrew Morrison and Lillie Florence (Thomas) Morrison.

Andrew attended school in the Madill, he was a 1944 graduate of Madill High School, and was baptized at Oklahoma Community Baptist Church.

Andrew Morrison proudly served in Germany with the United States Army during the Korean War from 1950 to 1952. He earned the rank of corporal with "Hell on Wheels," the 17th Engineering Battalion, 2nd Armored Division, which built bridges across the Rhine River.

An expert, self-employed welder for more than 50 years, he built boat houses with A.A. Wallace on Lake Texoma. Later, he designed the first W.W. Trailer for H.G. "Doc" Watkins, and worked 45 years building custom trailers as a contractor for W.W. Trailers in Madill. He retired as a welder in 2004.

Andrew's hobbies included photography, working with metal and wood and cooking his much admired barbecue and chili.

He leaves behind his wife of 59 years, the former Virginia Goff, whom he married October 3, 1950 in Madill. Other survivors include his daughters, Candis McDonough and her husband Robert of Pittsfield, Massachusetts; Renee Post and her husband Anthony of Bluewater, New Mexico; grandsons Clint Pierce of Pittsfield and Will and Canon Post of Bluewater; great grandsons Jake and Julius Pierce of Pittsfield; a brother, Donald Morrison of rural Madill and Donald's wife and son, Dorothy and Michael; cousins Elwanda Irwin of Hugoton, Kansas and Elaine Bagwell of Moore and numerous nieces and nephews.

Andrew Morrison was carried by horse-drawn antique hearse to his final resting place in Oakland Cemetery.
