William Eugene "Bill" Paddock Jr of Durant passed away on June 19, 2020 in Dallas, at the age of 70. He was born on September 20, 1949 in Durant to William Eugene Paddock Sr. and Billie Ann White.

A lifetime resident of Bryan County, William was a 1967 graduate of Caddo High School. He went on to further his education at Southeastern Oklahoma State University where he earned a triple masters degree in Biology, History, and Political Science. After his time at Southeastern he received a Laboratory Technician Degree and Master Laboratory Technician license from Grayson County College. He was also a Teacher of History and Biology at Bennington High School.
